	Notes	Average cost of gun-shot victims treated and release the same day = \$5200 (ER base Cost)  Average cost of gun-shot victims requiring surgery and hospital stay = \$95,867 (Surgery Cost)  1/3 of gun-shot victims who required surgery were release to rehabilitation centers where average total medical bill = \$179,000 (ER cost, Surgery & Rehabilitation Cost)  Formula for this study: (ER base cost + Surgery Cost + 1/3 Rehabilitation Cost) = \$123,600 per shooting victim requiring surgery.  1/2 of all homicide victims receive surgery before they die, so we use \$45,200 to represent half of all homicide victims.

Since victim may be a major financial contributor to the household, many families may need to apply for social services support. The estimate for this study is for 1 year of Social Service assistance. (\$782/mo x 12 months) x 2 people = \$18,768	National average for autopsies performed by the county corners office is <b>\$2,500</b> .

Combined sales taxes = 8% of purchases (State 4%, County 4%). If person earns 30k/year and 1/3 of income toward purchases = 8% of \$9,000 per year (\$720/yr Sales Tax)(\$1,200 Income Tax).

Loss Tax Revenue (One person going to jail)

But if person has to serve a 20 years sentence, then  $(\$720 \times 20 \text{ years}) = \$14,400 \text{ sales tax revenue}.$   $(\$1,200 \times 20 \text{ years}) = \$24,000 \text{ income tax revenue}.$  If shooting victim doesn't work for one year, then an additional \$1,920 (\$720 + \$1,200) of loss revenue is added. Total Loss Revenue = \$40,320

### State income tax= 4%.

Combined sales taxes = 8% of purchases (State 4%, County 4%). If person earns 30k/year and 1/3 of income toward purchases = 6% of \$9,000 per year (\$720/yr Sales Tax)(\$1,200 Income Tax).

But if person has to serve a *25 years* sentence, then (\$720 x 25 years) = **\$18,000 missed sales tax revenue.** 

 $($1,200 \times 25 \text{ years}) = $30,000 \text{ missed income tax revenue.}$ 

Loss Tax Revenue (Murder: Loss Revenue for 2 people)

Total Tax Loss per one individual = \$48,000

Total Loss Revenue for both suspect & murder victim = \$96,000
